If you are delinquent in your child support payments, or have an outstanding bench warrant, this is your opportunity to resolve your past due child support and bench warrant **WITHOUT** fear of being arrested.

You can avoid arrest
You can avoid incarceration
You can avoid further legal penalties

If you fail to take advantage of this opportunity the following actions *may* be taken:

You may be found in civil contempt and incarcerated
Names of delinquent payors may be published in newspapers and other media venues
Professional license suspension
Drivers license suspension
Passport denied
State and Federal tax refunds intercepted
Past due support reported to Credit Bureaus
Past due support reduced to a judgment

To take advantage of this opportunity, you must appear in person during the dates listed above between the hours of 8:00AM and 5:00PM at:

You must bring the following with you:

Amnesty 2005 Notice
Name and address of your employer or other income source
Verification of your health care coverage
A *good faith payment* on your past due child support balance

NOTE: Job placement services will be provided to unemployed parents. And, parents who do not receive an Amnesty 2005 Notice can walk-in to the Courthouse during the dates and times listed above.
